Mayor Mitchell opened the meeting by leading the Pledge of Allegiance. The invocation was given by Mary Norton. Roll call found Council members Drake, Oliver, Roche and Sproveri present, along with City Solicitor Carney, City Engineer Maas, City Manager Biondi, City Business Manager Heil, Police Chief Cherry, Deputy Fire Chief Hodak and Public Works Lead Operator Leofsky.

ROLL CALL

(1) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to approve the January 18, 2021 regular meeting minutes; Mr. Drake seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

APPROVE COUNCIL MINUTES

Hearing of the Public:

James and Sheri Taylor voiced their concerns regarding paving and the demise of brick streets. The project sheet states that tar and chip would start at Smith St and finish at Snyder Circle. The Taylor's stated that the street is brick from Smith to Congress. Mr. Biondi stated that was an error and tar and chip would not be placed over brick and the project sheet would be reviewed and updated. Mrs. Taylor suggested to Council to review the Case Study of Preserving Brick Streets with Data from Carnegie Mellon University that was published February 1, 2021. Mr. Biondi and Council thanked the Taylor's for bringing this to their attention.

HEARING OF THE PUBLIC

(2) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to receive and file letter from the United States Census 2020 recognizing the City of Corry; Ms. Oliver seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(3) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to receive and file letter dated February 8, 2021 from Erie County Tax Claim regarding the repository sale of parcel # 07-014-035.0-009.01 Elk St 60X303 IRR; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

REPOSITORY SALE (7) 14-35-9.01

Ms. Oliver made a motion to approve the repository sale of 07-014-035.0-009.01 to the City of Corry in the amount of \$250.00; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously. This property adjoins other property already owned by the City of Corry and will be turned into a bike/walking trail.

(4) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to receive and file the December 2020 District Judge Report; Mr. Roche seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(5) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to receive and file the January 2021 District Judge Report; Mr. Drake seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(6) Mr. Sproveri made a motion to receive and file the 2020 Year End Code Compliance Report; Ms. Oliver seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(8) Mr. Sproveri made a motion to receive and file the January 2021 Fire Report; Ms. Oliver seconded the motion which carried unanimously. Deputy Chief Hodak noted the 2020 Year End Code Compliance Report reinspection numbers were actually closer to 1,000 than the 600 reported. The new software did not account for all reinspections. There were 32 different types of violations. Mr. Sproveri reviewed the Fire Report in more detail. Mr. Hodak reminded everyone that the number of fires are up this year and encouraged everyone to check their smoke detectors and to make sure to have a fire safety plan with a meeting place setup.

(9) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to receive and file the January 2021 Police Report; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously. Chief Cherry reviewed the report in more detail and adding

that there were 2 charged with kidnapping, 1 for burglary, 1 for DUI, 1 for narcotics and several thefts. There were 5 reportable and 5 non-reportable accidents with 7 injuries He stated with the upcoming storm that all drivers slow down and be safe at all the intersections.

(10) Mr. Roche made a motion to receive and file the January 2021 New Vendor List; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(11) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to approve the Conflict of Interest agreement between the City of Corry, The Corry Redevelopment Authority and The Knox Law Firm; Mr. Roche seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(12) Mr. Roche made a motion for the approval of the payment of the bill list when funds are available and vouchers are signed; Ms. Oliver seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(13) Mr. Roche made a motion to approve the restriction of funds in the amount of the following:

- Sewer \$ 20,000
- Trash \$ 95,000
- Golf \$105,000
- General \$500,000

Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(14) Mr. Roche made a motion to approve the updating of the Seasonal and Part-time wage scale as presented to Council; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(15) Mr. Drake made a motion to approve the paving and tar and chip projects to be prepared and put out to bid by the City Engineer; Mr. Roche seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(16) Ms. Oliver made a motion to receive and file the event request for the Annual Easter Egg Hunt in Mead Park; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Ms. Oliver made a motion to approve the event request for the Annual Easter Egg Hunt to be held on April 3, 2021 starting at 11 am in Mead Park and to follow all Covid19 protocol; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.
