Mayor Mitchell opened the meeting by leading the Pledge of Allegiance and Chief Lathrop gave the invocation. Roll call found Council members Drake, Oliver, Roche and Sproveri present, along with City Manager Biondi, City Business Manager Heil, Fire Chief Lathrop and Public Works Lead Operator Leofsky.

(1) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to approve the July 19, 2021 regular meeting minutes; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(2) Ms. Oliver made a motion to receive and file letter dated July 21, 2021 from County of Erie related to Consultant Outreach for Implementation of Erie County parks, trails and recreation plan; Mr. Drake seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(3) Ms. Oliver made a motion to receive and file letter dated August 2, 2021 from Walter Bowen and Bill Sibble related to concerns regarding proposed Impact Corry Green Spaces Walkway; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(4) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to receive and file the July 2021 District Judge Report; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(5) Mr. Sproveri made a motion to receive and file the July 2021 Code Compliance Report; Mr. Drake seconded the motion which carried unanimously. Chief Lathrop stated there were 38 findings, 4 citations and 3 quality of life tickets.

(6) Mr. Sproveri made a motion to receive and file the July 2021 Fire Report; Mr. Drake seconded the motion which carried unanimously. Chief Lathrop stated there were a total of 88 calls for the month, over lapping calls occurred 10 times and average response time was 5:00 minutes from dispatch to arrival. Response time is under the national average. Traffic control assisted at the Harecreek Campground Christmas Lights Event. He announced the ladder truck is out commission for 3 weeks for service.

(7) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to receive and file the July 2021 Police Report; Ms. Oliver seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(8) Mr. Roche made a motion to receive and file the July 2021 New Vendor List; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(11) Ms. Oliver made a motion to approve the assignment and assumption of the lease agreement for the City property utilized as Hare Creek Campground; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously. Assignors of Gary and Marilyn McCray to assignees of Eric and July McCray.

(12) Mr. Roche made a motion to approve the assignment of a voting delegate for the Pennsylvania Municipal Leagues as Mayor David Mitchell; Ms. Oliver seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(13) Mayor Mitchell made a motion to approve the assignment of an alternate voting delegate for the Pennsylvania Municipal Leagues as Chelsea Oliver; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(14) Mayor Mitchell announced that he spoke to the new representative for the governor, Mike Ferritto and he is planning a meeting in Corry to look at our current and future projects.

(15) Mr. Roche made a motion for the approval of the payment of the bill list when funds are available and vouchers are signed; Mr. Drake seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

(16) Mr. Sproveri made a public announcement to remind residents to mow their lawns near the street and to make sure to bag all their trash. He also reminded everyone of the upcoming First Responder's Community Day and Parade on August 28, 2021.

Chief Lathrop stated that the dive team is organized and official and will be adding the water rescue that will be very beneficial. Next week will be the respiratory rescue physicals all the users of self-contained apparatus, drivers and volunteer divers. A basic firemen's class is scheduled for this fall with 13 of our members taking the training. The structure burn class was a huge success and the owner has cleaned up the area already.

(17) Mr. Leofsky stated the public works and water departments have been very busy including training of the new water department employees. The water building on Sciota the pavement is down and the fence is going up and the project should be completed next week. The streets department is continuing with blacktop, street sweeper and the ADA compliance ramps will be starting soon. The National Night Out went well. The community was able to see the City's current equipment. He stated the second round of tar and chipping will begin mid to late September.

(18) Ms. Oliver made a motion to receive and file the event request for the CAHS Homecoming Parade scheduled for September 16, 2021 at 6:00 pm; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Ms. Oliver made a motion to approve the event request for the CAHS Homecoming Parade; Mr. Sproveri seconded the motion which carried unanimously. Mr. Biondi stated that the parade route is awaiting approval from the State and if the route is not approved an alternate route can be used.

(19) Mr. Biondi stated that the departments have been working on the budget and rough draft will be discussed at the budget session later this month.

(20) Mr. Heil reviewed general fund income: real estate face taxes 102%, delinquent taxes 130%, overall general fund income 89.9% with expenses at 58.9%.


