AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL ORDINANCE # 1032 AND PROVIDE IN ITS PLACE AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE REMOVAL OF SNOW AND ICE FROM PUBLIC SIDEWALKS WITHIN THE CITY OF CORRY, ERIE COUNTY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council hereby finds the unabated accumulation of snow and ice on public property threatens the public health, safety, and welfare of the community, and constitutes a public nuisance, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council wish to provide a safe environment for all the citizens of Corry who use the public walkways going to and from necessary activities associated with life within the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORRY, ERIE COUNTY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA and enacted by the authority of the same that:

Section 1. Ordinance # 1032 is hereby repealed and replaced in its entirety by this ordinance # 1630.

Section 2. It shall be the duty and responsibility of the owner, occupant, or other person or entity in charge of any property in the City of Corry which is adjacent to any public sidewalk to remove or cause to be removed snow or ice from the entire width of such sidewalk, including any adjacent curb-cut, up to a maximum of forty-eight (48) inches, and if the same cannot be wholly removed, shall apply thereon sand or other proper substance so that such sidewalk shall be made safe for public travel.

Section 3. Snow or ice below six (6) inches shall be removed within twenty-four (24) hours, and six (6) inches or above shall be removed within thirty-six (36) hours of the cessation of snow fall or freezing. Such snow and/or ice shall be completely cleared from the sidewalk exposing the wearing surface of the sidewalk to a width not less than 48 inches or the actual width of the sidewalk, whichever is less.


Section 4. No person shall plow, shovel, or blow any snow or ice from a private property onto a public street, crosswalk, transit stop, sidewalk or any public property.

Section 5. Authority for Issuance of a Quality of Life Violation Ticket. Any person or persons violating any of the terms of this ordinance may, be subjected to Quality of Life Ticketing. Maximum fine is \$100.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.
